

What is Anarchism?

Anarchism:

the theory or doctrine that all forms of government are oppressive and undesirable and should be abolished.

[American Heritage Dictionary, 3rd Edition]

Etymology: Greek "an" (without) + "arch" (throne, rule or ruler). Anarchism means without rulers, *not* without rules.

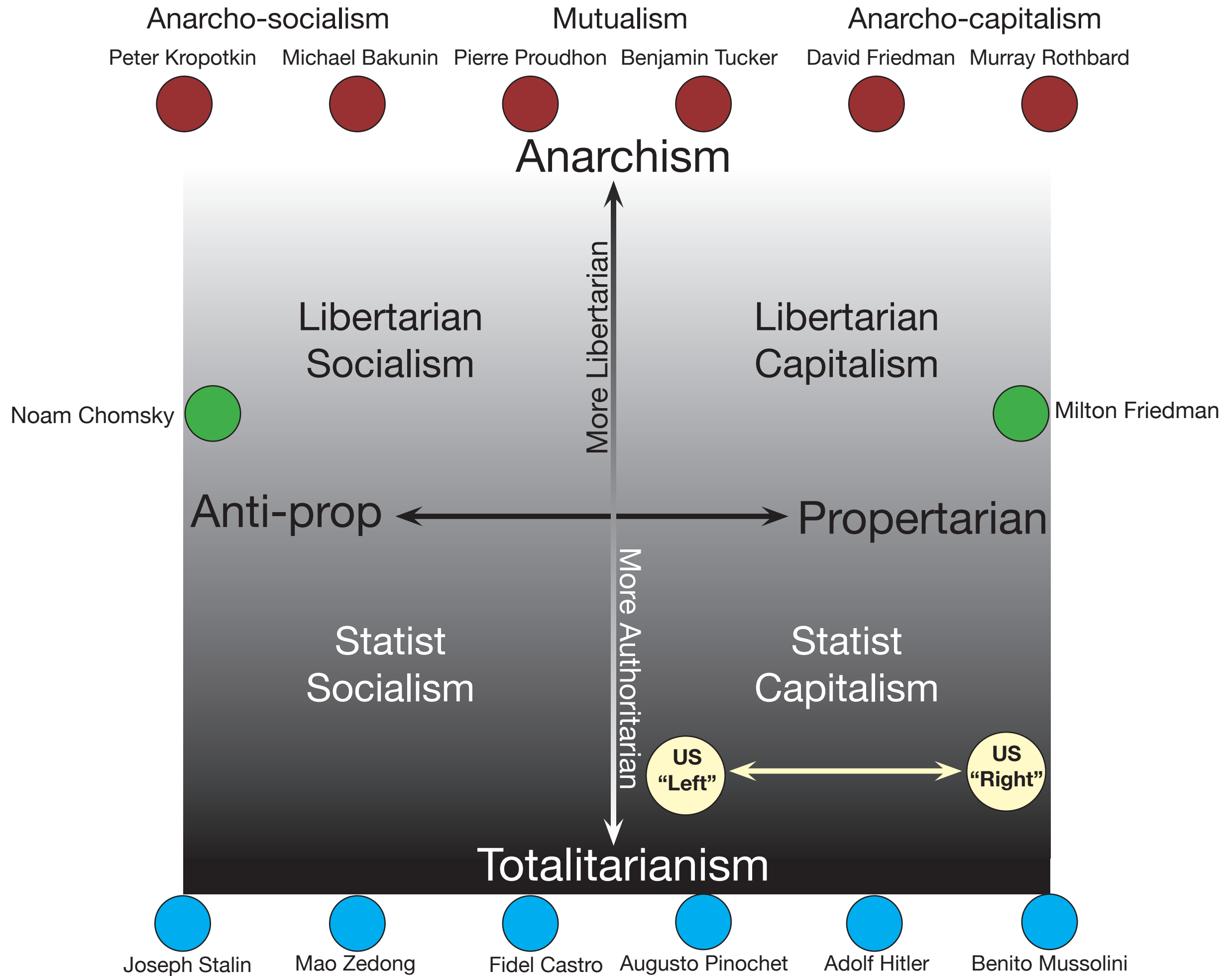

Free Markets - No State

- **Self-ownership** - sovereignty of the individual
- **Free trade** - no government interference whatsoever in commerce or production.
- **“Sticky” private property** - keep it until you consent to gift or sell it.
- **Market-generated law** - polycentric, competing police and courts.

What is Capitalism?

Capitalism:

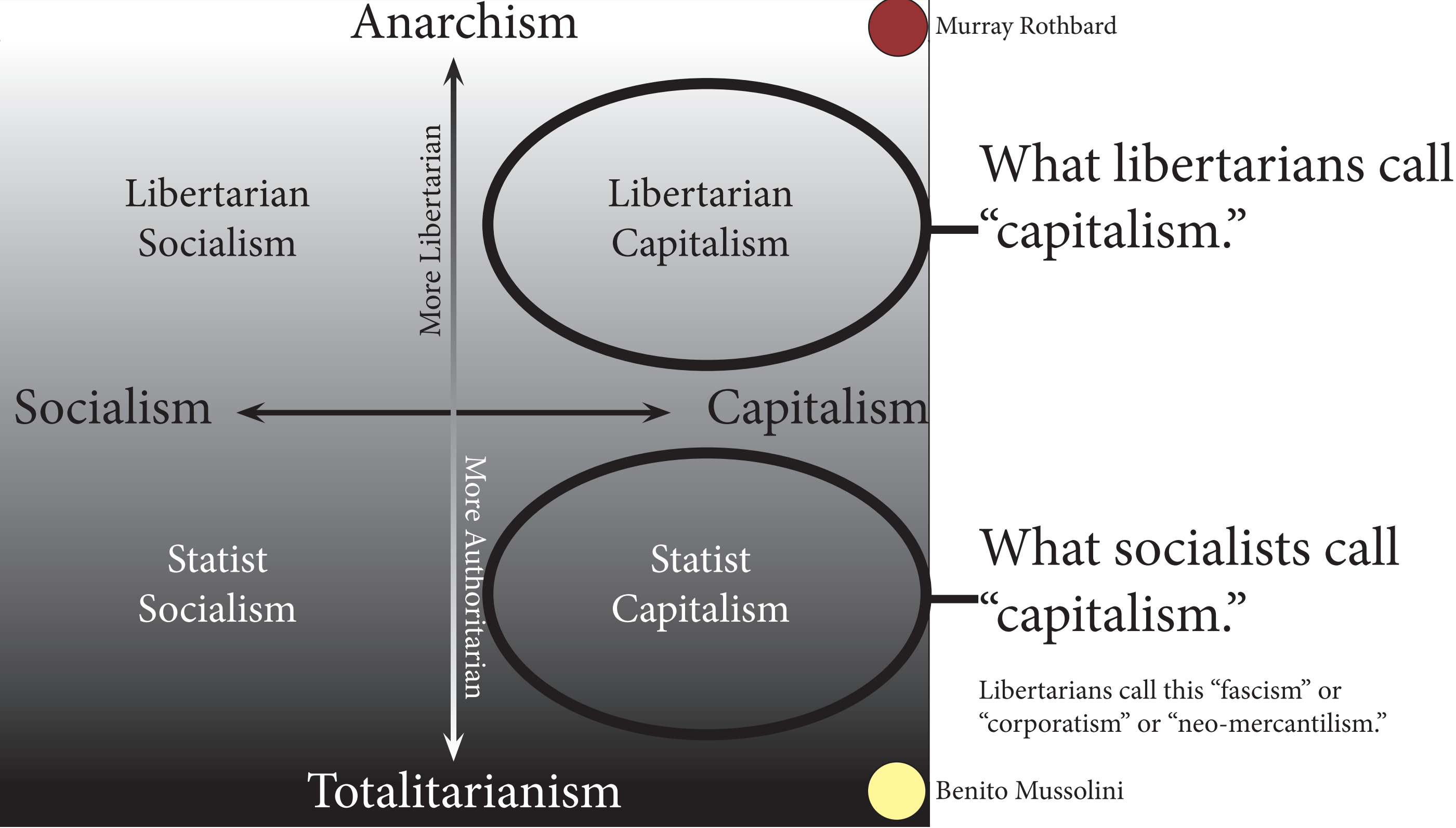
an economic system characterized by private property and free trade, with no government intervention whatsoever.

Don't confuse this with the Marxian definition: an economic system characterized by wage slavery (employment) and collusion between wealthy capitalists and the State.

Capitalists call this state-controlled economy “corporatism” or “economic fascism.” We strongly oppose such a system. We know that *corporatism is made possible by State power.*



Anarchism is the belief that states are unnecessary, oppressive, and should be abolished.



Statism is the belief that a state is necessary & beneficial. The extreme form is totalitarianism.
